## RRBN Research Grant Initiative

Following the announcement of a Five Million Naira (₦5,000,000) Research Grant for undergraduate students by the Registrar/Chief Executive, Dr. Idris Garba, the application procedure has now been unveiled.

Prospective applicants who meet the following requirements are eligible to apply:

1. Must be a final-year student.
2. Must have a minimum CGPA of 4.0.
3. Must be in good academic

standing and provide an accompanying letter signed and stamped by the Head of Department (HoD).

4. Must submit a research proposal in one of the following areas:

- Patient Care
- Radiation Protection
- Theory-Practice Gap in Radiography

Successful applicants could receive a grant of One Hundred Thousand Naira (₦100,000) to support their final-year research projects.

Applications should be submitted to the Registrar's Office via [info@rrbn.gov.ng](mailto:info@rrbn.gov.ng) within one month of the release of this bulletin.
